Main Theme of the Workshop

This workshop develops the proposal for a special issue on *International Relations of Mind and Body*, framed through Buddhism and Chinese medicine. Whereas most IR scholarship treats personhood abstractly—as citizen, subject, or rational actor—mind–body traditions foreground the embodied, spiritual, and cosmological dimensions of subjectivity. Both Buddhism and Chinese medicine articulate universality not as an external order but as a cosmos already immanent in the body. This shift enables us to reconceive "pluriversalism" as intrapersonal pluriverses, expanding IR's horizons beyond state- or system-centered frameworks.

The special issue seeks to generate conceptual payoffs: personhood as cosmos (qi, dependent origination, emptiness); ethics and governance as practices of harmonization and balance; and epistemologies that decenter rationalist IR not by adding "non-Western" voices, but by reconfiguring its foundations. Contributors from IR, philosophy, medical humanities, and religious studies will be invited to engage across four themes: (1) philosophical foundations of mind—body unity; (2) comparative horizons for sovereignty, agency, and ethics; (3) embodied IR as a challenge to state ontology; and (4) applications in peacebuilding, ecology, and health diplomacy.

The key challenges for participants will be to avoid exoticizing Buddhism and Chinese medicine, and to articulate their relevance to international relations rather than leaving them as cultural philosophy. Addressing these challenges will allow the issue to make a distinctive pluriversal contribution: showing how alternative cosmologies of self and world can reshape the theory and practice of IR.
